BIRD HUNTING

To hunt waterfowl, you require a Saskatchewan Wildlife Habitat Certificate, a game bird license and a Canadian migratory game bird hunting permit and stamp. The Canadian permit and stamp are available at Canadian Post Offices.

Geese, ducks, coots and common snipe may be hunted by no-residents. Season dates vary from zone to zone, generally beginning in September and lasting until early December.

To hunt upland game, hunters require a Saskatchewan Wildlife Habitat Certificate and a game bird license. Upland game bird hunting is open to non-residents and begins in mid-September.
